A reading from the Book of Acts.

The rulers, elders, and scribes assembled in Jerusalem, with Annas the high priest, Caiaphas, John, and Alexander, and all who were of the high-priestly family. When they had made the prisoners stand in their midst, they inquired, "By what power or by what name did you do this?" Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, "Rulers of the people and elders, if we are questioned today because of a good deed done to someone who was sick and are asked how this man has been healed, let it be known to all of you, and to all the people of Israel, that this man is standing before you in good health by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead. This Jesus is

`the stone that was rejected by you, the builders; it has become the cornerstone.'

1 John 3:16-24


Lector A reading from the First Letter of John.

We know love by this, that he laid down his life for us-- and we ought to lay down our lives for one another. How does God's love abide in anyone who has the world's goods and sees a brother or sister in need and yet refuses help?

Little children, let us love, not in word or speech, but in truth and action. And by this we will know that we are from the truth and will reassure our hearts before him whenever our hearts condemn us; for God is greater than our hearts, and he knows everything. Beloved, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have boldness before God; and we receive from him whatever we ask, because we obey his commandments and do what pleases him.

And this is his commandment, that we should believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and love one another, just as he has commanded us. All who obey his commandments abide in him, and he abides in them. And by this we know that he abides in us, by the Spirit that he has given us.

John 10:11-18

CelebrantThe Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.PeoplePraise and Glory to God.

Jesus said, "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away—and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep. I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it up again. I have received this command from my Father."


The night before he died he took bread, and when he had given you thanks, he broke it, gave it to his friends and said: Take, eat, this is my body which is given for you; do this to remember me.

Therefore heavenly Father, in this sacrament of suffering and death of your Son, we now celebrate the wonder of your grace and proclaim the mystery of our faith.








People From you, and through you, and for you are all things. To you be the glory forever.












The Breaking of the Bread







Announcements

Rev. Eileen is going on sabbatical, April 16 to July 15.

Every six years or so, clergy in the Diocese of Texas have an opportunity to take a sabbatical for refreshment and learning. This summer, Rev. Eileen will be celebrating 10 years since her ordination to the diaconate, and she will be taking her first ever sabbatical from April 16-July 15. While she is away, everything keeps going! There will be some great guest preachers during this time, supporting our own clergy. Vestry, staff, and other volunteers will be picking up responsibilities here and there. Our Associate Rector, The Rev. George Porter, will be the point person for pastoral care and the emergency pastoral care line, but he will share these responsibilities with those who have long-standing pastoral relationships. Your senior warden, Simone Talma Flowers, your junior warden, Jill LaCour, are here for you; and you will see Vestry people making announcements and available for you during Coffee Hour and time in the narthex. Your office staff, Aimee Estep and Diana Espinosa, will continue to keep you informed and keep us moving. We will be preparing for a strategic planning process that will lead into a Master Plan process during the fall, and, by the way, we will be the first congregation in the Diocese of Texas to do this work in a way that is intentional about lifting up the voices of our multicultural, multigenerational church community.

Rev. Eileen will be back in the office on July 15 having done some traveling, spent time with family, and worked on some writing.
